



STILL STRUGGLING WITH RHEUMATOID ARTHRITIS?

HELP TEST A POTENTIAL NEW TREATMENT OPTION

We are conducting a clinical study to test a potential new rheumatoid arthritis (RA) treatment which is given as an add-on to current methotrexate and TNF inhibitor therapy. This potential new treatment works in a different way from current treatments. Instead of mainly targeting the immune system, the potential new treatment is designed to slow down the activity of certain cells inside the joint that can cause inflammation and damage. Because it targets a different part of the disease process:

- It may help people whose RA is still active despite current treatments.
- It may offer a new treatment option without adding more immune-suppressing treatments.
- It could reduce the risk of infections compared with combining several immune-suppressing treatments.

This clinical study will include around 180 participants across the world and participation will last around 8 months. You may be suitable to take part if you:

- Have active rheumatoid arthritis.
- Have been on methotrexate and TNF inhibitors for 6 months and at a stable dose for 3 months.
- Are aged 18-75 years.
- Have a BMI between 18.5 and 32.
